Solør Bioenergy Group is influenced by warmer weather in the second quarter 2016 compared to the same period last year

- Net sales decreased by 5 percent compared with last year and amounted to SEK 166 M compared to SEK 175 M last year. For segment district heating net sales decreased by 8 percent compared with last year, amounting to SEK 127 M compared to SEK 138 M last year.
- The decrease is mainly attributable to warmer weather compared to the corresponding period last year.
- Gross contribution amounted to SEK 104 M compared to SEK 117 M.
- EBITDA was at SEK 6 M compared to SEK 23 M last year.
- Profit after tax amounted to SEK -85 M compared to SEK -54 M last year. The difference compared with last year is mainly related to net foreign currency exchange losses.

Solør Bioenergy Group shows a stable development for the first six months 2016

- Net sales increased by 3 percent compared with last year and amounted to SEK 508 M compared to SEK 493 M last year. For segment district heating net sales increased by 5 percent compared with last year, amounting to SEK 412 M compared to SEK 392 M last year.
- The increase is mainly attributable to the colder weather and higher energy deliveries during the high season in the beginning of the year.
- Gross contribution amounted to SEK 302 M compared to SEK 308 M.
- EBITDA was almost stable at SEK 106 M compared to SEK 109 M last year.
- The Group is well ahead of schedule related to covenant levels compared to the original plan from the waiver process, and is in compliance with all Group covenants.
- Profit after tax amounted to SEK -75 M compared to SEK -47 M last year. The difference compared with last year is mainly related to net foreign currency exchange losses.
- Total equity amounts to SEK 917 M compared to SEK 719 M last year, which gives an equity ratio of 25.1 percent.
